Parliaments and their ways

Parliaments most of the time not covered by FOI laws request mechanism

Information available does depend not only on the Parliament but on the Chambers (Senate and Representatives)

Vote information about MP sometimes not available

Digitalisation issues (material not available)

Internal processes not clear (and not much will of sharing them with you)

Early movers in Law service provision charge for services getting information from the Parliament.

We are all in this together behaviour

How can we help?

Increase demand for information

Exploit cracks on the wall

Easy visualization

Target users of Parliamentary information (niche market)

Target wider audience combining it with an appropriate communication message (citizen language)
